Bravo Zulu: Achieving Excellence in Relationship-Centered Care is a comprehensive training program for care partners of veterans living in Nevada eldercare communities, to improve cultural competence regarding military culture and understandings regarding the influence and impact of service experiences on the aging process and /or healthcare needs of veterans. While originally developed with Nevada veterans in mind, Bravo Zulu can also serve to improve the care and support of all elders, particularly persons living with dementia.

Bravo Zulu, named in honor of our veteran elders, consists of four (4) 4-hour modules. Attendees completing all four (4) modules will receive a Certificate of Completion.

Completion of all four (4) modules satisfies the Nevada State regulation (NRS 449.094) for dementia education. CEUs will also be awarded upon successful completion of each module for Licensed Administrators (Board of Examiners for Long Term Care Administrators), Licensed Nurses (Nevada State Board of Nursing), and Social Workers (Board of Examiners for Social Workers).
